
Training Day 2016

Dissertation Prize 2016



The Subsidence Forum will to offer a cash prize of £500 for the best undergraduate, final year dissertation for 2016. The subject matter must be related to subsidence but it does not necessarily have to be restricted to technical aspects; it may encompass wider issues, such as climate change, social and/or financial impact on

communities be they rural or urban and the wider environmental implications.

Heads of Department of Engineering in UK Universities have been approached and invited to participate. They will be asked to submit their highest rated dissertation. Each Department of Engineering will be restricted to one entry, obviously the highest marked.

Insurers Initiative Scheme

How can we raise the level of engagement? Perhaps the low profile of subsidence contributes to this with flood and fire taking precedence.

The Forum has consistently tried to attract and encourage the participation of Insurers into the Forum. An active recruitment campaign by the Executive has resulted in some limited take-up.

We value the participa-

tion of insurance companies but it has been difficult to engage with them either at AGMs or Training Days.

The Executive are continuing to work on this initiative with a number of insurers being identified and contact

with regards to membership.




The Subsidence Handbook

The 4TH edition of the Subsidence Handbook provides an excellent practical guide to subsidence in domestic property, which draws together key information from each of the disciplines and presents them in a format which is easy to use and understand. The

book guides the reader through the various stages of a subsidence claim in a logical manner, initially giving an outline of what subsidence heave and landslip is and the way to spot them. This is followed by defects which are commonly confused with subsidence

heave and landslip. Throughout the book a "model house" has been used to illustrate the key stages of a subsidence claim. The house is an inter-war semi-detached property familiar in towns across the country.
